Please find below an outline of Year 2's Curriculum for Spring 2 2023. As always, we will continue to support your children with the school routine and building relationships. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to be in touch. You can get us on the door in the morning or after school.

The areas of learning for **Year 2** this half term (Spring 2) are:

Geography

We are continuing our Geography study called 'Where on Earth are we?' We will be conducting fieldwork activities around our school site, making maps and completing surveys about what people think of the weather in Manchester!



English

In English we will be exploring historical recounts from a characters point of view and learning all about old toys like Major Glad.



<u>Maths</u>

Our first Maths focus is Measurement. We will begin by looking at height and length and then move on to measuring mass, capacity and temperature.

What Helps us Stay Healthy? Health and wellbeing

We will be learning about how we can stay healthy. Who helps us stay heathy? How medicines can help and affect us and why hygiene is important.

Forest School

Each term, 10 children from the class go out to do Forest School. As we are still in Spring term, this will be the same group of children as before the February holidays. The final 10 children will start their Forest School adventure in Summer 1.



Physical Education

In P.E. we will be learning skills for playing striking and fielding games such as rounders and cricket.

We will be practicing throwing, catching and batting.



We are learning about plants in Science this term. We will observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. We will also find out what plants need to grow and stay healthy.



In Computing this half term, we will start to learn how to code, writing algorithms to program characters to perform certain activities! We will be using Daisy the Dinosaur and Scratch Jnr for this.



In D&T we will design and make a Ferris wheel. We will consider what materials we will need and what skills we will have to learn to build it.
