Geography

In Geography, we will be continuing our study on South and Central America in regards to climate change measures in this part of the world. We will also be comparing the city centre of Manchester to San Jose in Costa Rica during an offsite visit.



English

Maths

This half term, we will be focussing on:

- Fractions, decimals and percentages
- Area, perimeter and volume
- **Statistics**

Once we are secure in these areas, we will move to applying our knowledge of these areas to problem solving.

Music

In music, we will be focussing on singing. We are preparing for a music festival where we will be performing 5 songs.



Religious Education

We will be continuing to consider 'Is it better to express vour



arts and architecture or in charity and generosity?' We will also be having an R.E day based on the Christian celebration of Faster

Physical Education

This half term's focus will be gymnastics. We will use our gymnastics knowledge to comment and analyse on performances and suggest aspects for improvements. We will also perform and land rotational jumps with control and accuracy.



Science

This half term we will be studying light, we will be drawing upon our knowledge from Year 3 by considering natural and manmade sources of light, reflection and shadows as well as how light travels.



Computing

In computing we will be covering programming, how to program and variables in programming. Our end goal will be to create our own game using coding.



Art

In Art this half term we will be looking at L. S. Lowry and his famous pieces of art. We will be comparing Lowry to some local artists from Manchester. We will create a final piece taking inspiration from all artists covered by using paint and dry media.


French
