By exploring the real world, our children understand geography better and connect with it more deeply. Fieldwork helps our children apply what they've learned and develop important skills like observation and critical thinking. Overall, it helps us and our children to appreciate the world around us.

The children spent several months practising for their performance and presented themselves beautifully whilst we were there. 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**British Science Week** As part of British Science Week, Year 4 and Year 6 have taken part in a project called Building Better Worlds. Throughout the week, the children took part in a range of activities where they could use scientific skills to answer an enquiry question. The focus of the project was 'biodiversity' and the children investigated the effect of soil compaction on the biodiversity around our school. We were very lucky to be visited by a civil engineer who gave an insight to her job and helped with our enquiries.

February, Year 6 made the exciting trip across Manchester to the velodrome to watch the British Cycling Championships! After doing cycling for half a term with Craig from British Cycling, we were very excited to see some top level cycling! 




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themed tea party, the children loved being with their special ones, planting seeds in our outside area, showcasing their work and what they like to get up to in school...while enjoying a yummy treat!
